# 1. interRAI for Ontario Health Teams: Learning to RAI

## Thursday November 10<sup>th</sup> 9 am - 4 pm

This one-day interactive workshop will introduce you to the client information captured through an interRAI assessment routinely completed on home and community care clients across Ontario.

You will learn about the clinical assessment protocols (CAPs) and scales, and how to use this information to support a client – centred care plan. The CAPs assist providers in understanding and prioritizing the unique needs of each client. The interRAI scales provide a snapshot in time of a client's strengths and challenges, may be used to monitor changes to a client's status overtime, and evaluate the success of your care plan.

Participants will have the opportunity to create a sample care plan based on a real-world sample of client assessment results and explore the scales in depth through interactive exercises.

In a supportive and engaging environment, participants will learn about:

- where, when, and how assessments are being completed across home and community care in Ontario.
- the rich client information documented through the interRAI Home Care and interRAI Community Health Assessment (interRAI CHA) system.
- the clinical assessment protocols (CAPS), and how they support the development of client centred care plans.
- the scales, and how to interpret the scales to better understand the clients' strengths and challenges, as well as evaluate the effectiveness of care plans.

### Who Should Attend:

This workshop will be of interest to all service providers involved home and community care who would like to better understand interRAI assessment results, and how to use them to guide decision-making related to care.

*Prerequisite:* No prior experience with interRAI assessment systems is required.

**Required Materials**: Participants will need a copy of the <u>Clinical Assessment Protocol manual for Community and Longterm Care Assessment Instruments</u>. Participants may purchase a manual from the interRAI catalogue (links provided above). All other materials will be provided.

## 2. interRAI CHA® New Assessor Certificate

Tuesday October 4th, 18th, 25th, November 1st, 8th and 15th from 9:00 am to 12 noon.

This interactive course will provide participants with the knowledge and skills needed to conduct competent assessments using the interRAI Community Health Assessment® (interRAI CHA®). Participants will also learn how to use the assessment generated information (clinical assessment protocols and scales) to both inform and evaluate client-centred care plans.

This workshop will cover the updated content of the interRAI CHA v 9.1.4 as well as v 9.1.3 (the version of the CHA originally adopted by Ontario in 2010). In a supportive and engaging environment, participants will learn:

- the general principles of conducting an interRAI CHA assessment
- to accurately document client information through the interRAI Community Health Assessment (interRAI CHA) system, including the functional supplement
- to use the Clinical Assessment Protocols (CAPS) to inform the development of client centred care plans
- to use the scales to understand the clients' strengths and challenges, as well as evaluate the effectiveness of care plans in addressing client needs

Participants will simulate the assessment process in the virtual classroom using a case study.

A certificate will be awarded upon the successful completion of the workshop.

Prerequisite: No prior experience with the CHA assessment is required

### Who Should Attend:

This workshop is designed for individuals responsible for performing client assessments and making decisions related to care.

**Required Materials:** The interRAI CHA coding manual is not included in the registration fee. Participants will need a copy of both an <u>interRAI CHA manual (Canadian version)</u> and the <u>Clinical Assessment Protocol manual for Community and Long-term Care Assessment Instruments</u>. Participants may purchase a manual from the interRAI catalogue (links provided above).

# 3. interRAI CHA® Refresher Workshop

Tuesday November 29, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00pm. Tuesday December 6, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00pm.

This one-day workshop will improve assessors coding skills. Particular attention is paid to those questions in the interRAI CHA which assessors commonly find a challenge and emphasizes the IADL and ADL assessment sections of the assessment. During this interactive session, assessors will participate in small group exercises using a case study, with ample opportunity for discussion and reflection.

During this interactive session, assessors will:

- improve their ability to accurately complete the interRAI CHA Core and Functional
- participate in active learning exercises
- identify and work through knowledge gaps from reflective analysis

### Who Should Attend:

This workshop will be of interest to experienced interRAI assessors who are interested in improving their assessment skills and knowledge of coding for the most challenging sections and questions in the assessment (e.g. ADLs and IADLS).

This updated version of the CHA perfectly aligns the core CHA and the functional supplement with the interRAI Home  $Care^{\circ}$ . Ontario's Integrated Assessment Record (IAR) is able to support v 9.1.4 for sharing the information within a client's circle of care. The workshop content will include details of all changes to the interRAI CHA questions, definitions, clinical assessment protocols (CAPs) and scales.

In a supportive and engaging environment, participants will:

- Become competent in the coding for all new questions in the interRAI CHA® v 9.1.4
- Become competent in the meaningful use of the new scales and outcome measures to support and evaluate client-centred care plans.
